DEATH OF MRS. LATTIN, A
PIONEER OF VALPARAISO

Mary Elizabeth Lattin, eighty-five, pioneer resident of the state and a resident of Valparaiso since 1833, died at 3:20 p. m. October 19, at the home of her son, Robert, at Valparaiso. She and her husband, Clinton Lattin, were the first couple to be married in what is now Lincoln.

With her mother and sisters, Mrs. Lattin came to Nebraska in 1851 from Nodaway county, Missouri. The family settled at Salt basin where Capitol Beach is now located. In the year 1866 she met her husband who was at that time a trapper, and they were married a few months later by Judge Luke Lavender, who built the first house in Lincoln. Their son, Lewis, was the first white child born in Lancaster county.

After another year the family removed to near Valparaiso and in 1833 Mr. and Mrs. Lattin moved to Valparaiso where she continued to live at her own home until a short time ago when she became ill and was taken to her son, Robert's home where she remained until her death.

Surviving are three sons, Robert, of Valparaiso, Martin V. of Holy Cross, Alaska, and Oliver C. of Valparaiso; one daughter, Mrs. Inez Guttery, of Hood River, Ore. Two children, Lewis and Ira, preceded their mother to death. There are also eight grandchildren and thirteen great grandchildren.

Funeral services were held Friday afternoon at the home of Robert Lattin with Rev. Laurence E. Nye, officiating. A quartet of the local Methodist church, Mr. Fike, Mrs. Petermichel, Mrs. Edwards and Rev. Nye, sang. The funeral was under the direction of Mr. Cecil Wadlow, of Lincoln.

Clinton Eli Lattin, an old settler of Valparaiso, passed away after a two week's illness, resulting from an attack of apoplexy. Mr. Lattin was known by almost every man, woman and child in our community, and will be missed by them all. He was one of the few remaining pioneers of the plains, having been a driver of one of the old stage coach lines thru the Kansas and Nebraska territory in the Indian days. He was also a personal friend of Buffalo Bill, and could tell many interesting tales of the escapades of that noted character.

His funeral was held at his late residence on Wednesday at 2 p. m., conducted by Rev. J. A. Martin. Remains were interred in Valparaiso cemetery.

OBITUARY

Clinton Eli Lattin was born May 4, 1843, in Indiana, being 78 years, 2 mo. and 29 days old. He was married to Mary Elizabeth Owen's April 16, 1866, at Lancaster Center, which is now the city of Lincoln. They were the first couple married in Lancaster County. To them were born six children, two of whom preceded the deceased to the unseen cime, Lewis M. and Ira. Those remaining to mourn his loss are Oliver and Robert of Valparaiso, Martin of Alaska, and Mrs. J. D. Guttery of Hood River, Oregon, 9 grand children, 8 great grand children and many friends. He was a pioneer of this state. In his early days he united with the Methodist Church.—Contributed.
